



GOD SAVE THE KING.

Extract from Summary of Orders which will be issued by the G.O.C. for the Parade of the Belfast Division for Inspection by Sir Edward Carson in the Agricultural Show Grounds, Balmoral, on Saturday, September 27th, 1913.

1. COMPOSITION. For the purpose of the inspection the Division will be composed of 4 Regiments (North Belfast, South Belfast, East Belfast, and West Belfast.

Each Regiment will consist of 4 Battalions, with the exception of the West Belfast Regiment, which will consist of 2 Battaltions.

Strength of each Battalion -- about 800 rank and file.

Strength of each Company -- not to exceed 100 rank and file.

All supernumeraries, with the exception of Company Guides, to be in the ranks.

The Company guide of the leading Company of each Battalion will act as Battalion guide.

Each Battalion guide will carry a coloured flag of direction, with the number of his Battalion on it.

Colours of flags of direction are : -

North Belfast Regiment - Red.
South Belfast Regiment - Yellow.
East Belfast Regiment - Blue.
West Belfast Regiment - Orange.

3. ASSEMBLY. Companies and Battalions will parade in their own localities under orders of their respective Commanders. Regiments will be formed up in their own districts and will move off, each Battalion IN FOURS FROM THE RIGHT AS UNDER: -

SOUTH BELFAST REGIMENT will be formed in column of Route, head of No. 1 Battalion in Donegall Pass facing Balmoral, ready to march off at 3.30 p.m. March by Malone Road, and enter Show Grounds by Gate D (Stockman's Lane).

east Belfast Regiment will be formed in column of Route, head of No. 1 Battalion in University Street facing Malone Road, ready to march at 3.45 p.m. March by Malone Road following South Regiment. Enter Show Grounds by Gate D.

NORTH BELFAST REGIMENT will be formed in column of Route, head at Carlisle Circus facing Royal Avenue, ready to march at 3.0 p.m. March by Royal Avenue, Bedford Street, Lisburn Road. Enter Show Grounds by Gate B.

WEST BELFAST REGIMENT will be formed in column of Route in Shankill Road, head at Shankill Orange Hall facing Royal Avenue, ready to march at 3.15 p.m.

March by Royal Avenue, Bedford Street, Lisburn Road, Follow North Regiment. Enter Show Grounds by Gate B.
