COUNTY OF Dataghad.Confidential report for month of May 1914.

I beg to report that the state of this County is peaceful. No person has been receiving protection during the past month either constantly or by patrol.

The Irish Volunteer movement both in the County & City has made very considerable progress during the month. There are now four branches of the National Volunteers in the County with 365 members & one branch in the City with 710 members making a total of 1075 members. Additional branches will probably be formed shortly in other places in the County.

The class of persons joining this force are on the whole respectable consisting for the most part of clerks, shop assistants & superior artisans. In Dinganeen a good many labourers are enrolled. This movement is now supported by all classes of Nationalists with the exception of members of the Ali for Ulster who up to the present have held aloof.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians, G.A. Smith & Gaelic League are all strong supporters of the Volunteer movement & the force is largely

recruited from the members of these organizations especially from the former of them whose president R. A. Kelly is Commander of the Waterford branch. A number of persons of considerable local influence have attended & spoken at meetings held in furthering the organization of these various branches. On the City, in addition to R. A. Kelly who is the manager of a hardware business & president of the City branch Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Mayor Add Alderman P. Power, & Messrs Kean & Murphy solicitors have identified themselves with this movement. At Xiomore Dr Donnelly (son) J. P., Dr Donnelly (hus) at Dungourney J. P. & P. F. Walsh (of Tallow) R. C. Gorman J. P. & P. F. Walsh (of Tallow) are persons of influence who strongly sympathize with the movement. At Dungourney J. A. Lynch (newspaper proprietor & editor) & Mr. Browne Shopkeeper & District Coraller have taken up the same attitude. The Roman Catholic clergy with a few exceptions are in sympathy with this movement & several of them both in the City & County have expressed their sympathy either by writing letters in favor of it or by attending meetings. that the majority of these gentlemen, though approving of the force in its present form, would be sorry to see them armed & capable of really proving a disturbing factor.

The organisation of those five branches of National Volunteers is rapidly improving. In the City & at Dismore they are divided into companies & all of them are drilled regularly, generally twice or three times in the week. A proportion of the City force have also been given some military instruction for which purpose a Lee Enfield carb rifle is used. This rifle has been provided

by P. Burke a cycle agent in Waterford. About twenty five of the City force carry sword bayonets & a few of them have water bottles & bandoliers. A number of them both in the County & town carry dummy wooden rifles & they are drilled in the use of them.

There are four drill instructors attached to the Waterford City Corps all of whom have had military training. Eight are attached to the three branches in Cappoquin almost all of whom have had some military training except one. Three instructors are attached to the Dunguaire branch all of whom have had military training.

- III. No evictions took place during the month & no evicted farms were either relet or surrendered. Satisfactory relations exist between landlord & tenant.
- IV. No Scout Societies exist in the County & City. A list of the various organisations is attached. These have been generally inactive during the month with the exception of the G.A.A. & A.O.A. branches which have interested themselves in the Volunteer movement.
- V. No Boycotting or Intimidation exist.
- VI. The passing of the third Reading of the Home Rule Bill was celebrated throughout the County & in the City. Processions took place in Waterford & in the principal County towns, & bonfires were lit. In Waterford itself a large procession was formed which paraded the principal streets & suburbs & which was attended by the Mayor, & by Mr. Martin Murphy M.P. Three bands & about 400 of the local volunteer force formed part of the procession. The general feeling throughout the County & City seems to be

that all serious danger to the Bill from

serious drawback, as the opinion among
Nationalists is that the Government will
not go further than the six years exclusion
already held out, & that as it seems certain
that this proposal will not be accepted
by the Unionist party, the probability is that
the Bill in its present form will become law.

was passed totally excluding Ulster or a
portion of it, considerable movement would
be aroused here, though it is hard to say
what form that movement would take.
Much I think would depend on the
